

Part 1: Materia Medica:

Key prescribing information is included in summary format. Doses for both liquid and tablet forms are provided. The actions selected represent the clinical activity of each herb. Key indications given are those that represent a consensus view on how the herb is best used clinically. For clarity, the indications are grouped around themes only.

Part 2: Actions Index:

The Actions Index is drawn from the Materia Medica section and contains listings of herbs grouped by the actions in alphabetical order. To facilitate the prescribing process, the herbal clinician needs a clear understanding of herbs in terms of their reliable, well-established actions.

Part 3: Therapeutic Index:

Contains herbs listed by indications largely compiled from the Materia Medica section. Additional herbs are included where relevant. A major feature of the Therapeutic Index is the extensive use of cross-referencing which greatly assists the final selection of herbs.

Part 4: Treatment Protocols:

Example treatment protocols are provided for the treatment of 50 common health problems. Both tablet and liquid protocols are given.


Part 5: Herbs Contraindicated in Pregnancy and Other Contraindications:


