TOYOHARI™® - EAST ASIAN NEEDLE THERAPY

The Brisbane Branch of the Australasian Branch of the Toyohari Association is pleased to announce our next introductory course in Toyohari.

Toyohari is an acupuncture style that was developed by blind practitioners from the Meridian Therapy school. It is firmly based in the understanding of how qi flows and is balanced in the meridians, Yin and Yang and Five Phase theory as described in the Chinese medical classics, the Ling Shu and Nan Jing. It does not share a herbal background. Diagnosis is based on the Four Examinations with an emphasis on abdominal and meridian palpation and six position pulse assessment. Although a Toyohari treatment looks simple, it is technically very subtle and sophisticated. Clinically a treatment includes a constitutional or 'root' approach and a symptom focussed 'branch' component which can easily be combined with your current symptomatic techniques. Unique to Toyohari is a system of practical training methods that will clarify and accelerate your diagnostic and needling skills. Theory is kept to a minimum with priority given to table practice.

Once the introductory course is completed, participants are eligible to train with the Japanese teachers at National Meetings and the biannual Tokyo Summer School.
